You've got this: The Breast Cancer Screening (BCS-E) HEDIS[®] measure

The BCS-E measure evaluates the percentage of patients 50 to 74 years of age who were recommended for routine breast screening and had at least one mammogram to screen for breast cancer in the past two years. The current look-back period is October 1, 2022 – December 31, 2024. (Remember, this measure switched to the electronic-only ECDS reporting method in 2023.) Don't risk getting removed from Medicaid: Prepare for revalidation



The first revalidation notices to providers were sent via email by the Department of Healthcare and Family Services (HFS) in September. This process will continue into 2025, and providers will have 90 days to complete revalidation after the notice is received—**or risk being removed from the Medicaid program**.

QI Insights: Four shots to disrupt the status quo on Adult Immunization Status (AIS-E)

As many adults obtain their seasonal influenza vaccines, it's the ideal time to ensure they are up to date on the other vaccines reported in the AIS-E HEDIS® measure: zoster; pneumococcal; and tetanus and diphtheria or tetanus, diphtheria, and acellular pertussis (Td/Tdap).

Emphasize the importance of the <u>shingles (zoster) vaccine</u> with members ages 50 and older and those with weakened immune systems, as the risk of developing a painful, blistering shingles rash increases with age, and could lead to complications. Our plan tends to observe the lowest immunization rates for shingles.

Fee schedule updates, rate changes, & billing updates

Claim alerts and known issues are posted on our <u>website</u>, along with updates from Meridian about proactively reprocessing claims. Claims should not be resubmitted unless otherwise indicated. If you have questions about billing, contact your assigned Provider Engagement Administrator or representative. If your practice doesn't have an assigned representative, please complete our <u>intake form</u>.

- <u>Air ambulance rate increases took effect January 1, 2024</u>.
- Effective for dates of service on or after **October 1, 2024**, Peer Recovery Support (PRS) services will be covered when services are delivered by a licensed provider, <u>according to this notice from HFS</u>.
- <u>HFS issued a notice</u> clarifying medical necessity requirements for COVID-19 testing and confirming ordering/referring/prescribing (ORP) billing requirements.

In case you missed it

- Effective **October 1, 2024**, all services for out-of-network providers will be paid at the standard <u>Meridian or YouthCare in-network Medicaid rates</u> applicable for each provider type.
- Beginning **October 31, 2024**, HFS will start monitoring compliance with its new EVV requirements for home health care services providers. Read more in the <u>recent HFS notice</u> and <u>our September roundup for providers</u> with updates about the EVV transition.
- <u>Changes are coming for MY 2025 HEDIS</u> including key modifications to the blood pressure control measure, which will be transitioning to the electroniconly reporting method. You can also <u>learn more at an upcoming October</u> <u>Quality webinar</u>.
- The deadline to submit all HEDIS medical records for MY 2024 data entry is December 13 via secure email to <u>ILHEDISOps@mhplan.com</u> or by fax to <u>833-734-1938</u>.
